Archived note: a sampling of earlier updates (check with mst.org about any changes):

- Look over MST's services changes so you're aware of such things as these from September 2016: NEW! Line 85: New route serving Templeton, Paso Robles, San Miguel, Camp Roberts, and Fort Hunter Liggett. This expansion of service to Templeton marks the farthest south MST bus service has ever traveled!
- Line 78: Service between Presidio of Monterey (with stops in downtown Monterey) and downtown Santa Cruz! Since 2/2/13 (and still current, as of 5/26/13): On weekends, Line 78 trips are virtually non-stop between downtown Santa Cruz and downtown Monterey, reducing travel time to about an hour (approx 10 min more than by car). On weekdays, Line 78 also serves Castroville and Salinas Road Park-N-Ride in Monterey County, plus Aptos, Cabrillo College, and Dominican Hospital in Santa Cruz County.
- Free Wi-Fi at Marina Transit Exchange, 280 Reservation Road.
- Free Wi-Fi on *long-distance* MST trips, such as, routes 23, 55 (Express), 79, 82, 83. As of 4/17/15, MST currently has 12 buses with Wi-Fi on board. They include bus numbers 4501-4503 (MCIs) and the 1800-series Gillig coaches. When these buses are available MST uses them on the long-distance "commuter" routes (23, 55, 81, 82, and 83). However, there may be times when maintenance needs to pull a bus to work on it, so MST cannot guarantee Wi-Fi availability on any specific routes.
- Since 2010, there's a snazzy new MST bus that goes to San Jose (with bike racks underneath). Check out the <u>San Jose Express</u>! The cool new buses also provide service to Fort Hunter Liggett and some South County routes.
